Dear Fellow Pennsylvanians,

We are proud to share with you the results of one of the Pennsylvania Lottery's most successful years providing services and programs to seniors across the commonwealth. The Pennsylvania Lottery remains the only Lottery in the nation that contributes all proceeds to programs that benefit older residents.

Pennsylvania has the third highest percentage of elderly residents with about 2.5 million older than 60 and more than 302,000 older than 85. As Pennsylvania's older population grows, we are committed to growing along with it. To this end, the Pennsylvania Lottery and the departments of Revenue, Aging, Transportation and Public Welfare have strengthened relations in an effort to work together to better serve older Pennsylvanians. While each agency plays a different role in providing services for older residents, our combined efforts provide greater efficiency and quality of service.

The Lottery continues to fund the PACE and PACENET low-cost prescription drug programs; the Property Tax/Rent Rebate program; a free and reduced-fare transit program; a long-term living services program; and 52 Area Agencies on Aging, including more than 600 full- and part-time senior centers throughout Pennsylvania. Every day the Lottery provides vital services including hot meals, bus rides, affordable prescriptions, medical services and educational opportunities. Lottery funds help improve the quality of life for older Pennsylvanians, and the programs funded by Lottery help older residents maintain their independence.

This annual Economic and Benefit Impact Report illustrates how Pennsylvania's communities were impacted by the Lottery in fiscal year 2008-09. It outlines where and how Lottery moneys were distributed to each county and program. Prize payouts and retailer commissions contributed to local economies, and net revenues provided important benefits to older Pennsylvanians all across the commonwealth.
