Thanks to players, the Lottery has contributed nearly \$23.7 billion to programs benefiting older Pennsylvanians.

Long-Term Living Services

The Pennsylvania Lottery funds long-term living services for qualified residents. These include services provided at home, in the community or in a care facility.

In 2012-13, the Lottery provided more than **\$309 million** for long-term living services for more than **19,000** residents.

On average, the Lottery supported the delivery of nearly **\$847,000** in long-term living services, every day.

Low-Cost Prescription Assistance

The PACE and PACENET programs offer low-cost prescription medications to qualified residents age 65 and older.

In 2012-13, Lottery support for these prescription programs totaled more than **\$190 million**.

PACE and PACENET enrollees received more than **9.7 million** prescriptions, and Lottery funding helped to provide nearly **26,600** prescriptions to older Pennsylvanians, every day.

Property Tax & Rent Rebates

This program provides rebates to eligible Pennsylvanians age 65 and older; widows and widowers 50 and older; and people with disabilities 18 and older. The maximum standard rebate is \$650, but supplemental rebates for qualifying homeowners can boost rebates to \$975.

In 2012-13, Lottery and slots revenue provided more than **\$282 million** in rebates to more than **598,000** households across the state.

About **\$772,699** in rebates was returned, every day.

Local Services, Senior Centers & Hot Meals

Fifty-two Area Agencies on Aging serve residents of all 67 counties. They administer senior centers and coordinate services at the local level, including:

- **Assessments & program referrals**
- **Home-delivered meals**
- **Health insurance counseling**
- **Ombudsman services**
- **Legal assistance**
- **Protective services**
- **Transportation**

In 2012-13, the Lottery contributed more than **\$248 million** to Area Agencies on Aging across Pennsylvania.

These funds helped to provide **8.3 million** meals served at senior centers and delivered to seniors' homes. Lottery funds helped provide more than **22,700** hot meals for older Pennsylvanians, every day.

Free and Reduced-Fare Transportation

Any Pennsylvania resident age 65 or older can ride public transit for free, while commuter rail trips are \$1 each. Those 65 and older also qualify to use on-demand, shared-ride services at reduced rates.

In 2012-13, more than **\$159 million** in Lottery funds provided for nearly **35 million** free transit rides and more than **4 million** shared rides.

On average, the Lottery helped provide more than **107,000** free and reduced-fare shared rides for older Pennsylvanians, every day.
