

## A message from the Secretaries of Revenue and Aging...

Dear Fellow Pennsylvanians,

We are proud to share with you the significant impact Lottery funds have on the lives of older Pennsylvanians. Pennsylvania's Lottery is the only state lottery in the nation that devotes all of its proceeds to funding services for older residents.

Pennsylvania ranks second among states with the largest proportion of adults over 65 and third among states with the largest proportion of adults over 60. As Pennsylvania's older population grows, we are committed to growing along with it. To this end, the Pennsylvania Lottery and the Departments of Revenue and Aging have strengthened relations in an effort to work together to better serve older Pennsylvanians. While each agency plays a different role in providing services for older residents, our combined efforts provide greater efficiency and quality of service.

This report illustrates how Pennsylvania's communities were impacted by the teamwork of these three organizations in Fiscal Year 2002-03. This annual Economic and Benefit Impact Report is designed to provide information on exactly where and how Lottery moneys are distributed to each county and program. Prize payouts and retailer commissions contributed to local economies, and record-breaking Lottery sales provided record-breaking contributions to programs benefiting older Pennsylvanians.

The Lottery continues to fund programs including property tax and rent rebates; free and reduced-fare transit; the low cost prescription drug programs PACE and PACENET; and the 52 Area Agencies on Aging, including 650 full- and part-time senior centers throughout Pennsylvania. About 37 cents from every Lottery dollar earned is dedicated to these programs, and Lottery has provided more than \$13.8 billion to programs for the Commonwealth's older residents since its inception more than 31 years ago.
