

**A message from the Secretaries of Revenue and Aging...**

Dear Fellow Pennsylvanians,

We are proud to share with you the significant impact Lottery funds have on the lives of older Pennsylvanians. The Pennsylvania Lottery is the only Lottery in the nation that devotes all of its proceeds to programs benefiting older residents.

Pennsylvania ranks third among states with the largest proportion of adults over 60 and 65. As Pennsylvania's older population grows, we are committed to growing along with it. To this end, Governor Rendell signed into law an expansion of the PACE and PACENET programs, effective Jan. 1, 2004. The Lottery has always been the largest contributor to these low-cost prescription drug programs, and its recent growth made this expansion possible. Now, more than 100,000 additional older Pennsylvanians qualify for enrollment in these programs.

The annual Economic and Benefit Impact Report illustrates how Pennsylvania's communities were impacted by the Lottery in Fiscal Year 2004-05. It outlines where and how Lottery moneys are distributed to each county and program. Prize payouts and retailer commissions contributed to local economies, and record-breaking Lottery sales provided record-breaking contributions to programs benefiting older Pennsylvanians.

The Lottery continues to fund programs including PACE and PACENET; property tax and rent rebates; free and reduced-fare transit; and the 52 Area Agencies on Aging, including more than 650 full- and part-time senior centers throughout Pennsylvania. About one-third of every dollar spent on Lottery games is dedicated to these programs, and the Lottery has provided more than \$15.5 billion to programs for the Commonwealth's older residents since its inception more than 33 years ago.
