

A message from the Secretaries of Revenue and Aging...

Dear Fellow Pennsylvanians,

We are proud to share with you this summary of how the Pennsylvania Lottery benefits local communities and residents across the state. Since the Pennsylvania Lottery sold its first ticket in 1972, it has contributed more than \$20.1 billion for programs that benefit older residents. It remains the only lottery in the nation that devotes 100 percent of its profits to senior programs.

Pennsylvania residents age 65 or older represent 1.9 million, or 15.3 percent, of the state's population, a percentage that ranks our state third highest in the country in terms of elderly residents. As Pennsylvania's older population grows, we are committed to growing along with it.

The Lottery continues to fund the PACE and PACENET low-cost prescription drug programs; the Property Tax/Rent Rebate program; free transit and reduced-fare, shared-ride programs; long-term living services; and 52 Area Agencies on Aging, including more than 600 full- and part-time senior centers throughout Pennsylvania. **Every day** the Lottery provides vital services including hot meals, bus rides, affordable prescriptions, medical services and educational opportunities. Lottery funds help improve the quality of life for older Pennsylvanians, and the programs funded by Lottery help older residents maintain their independence.

This annual Economic and Benefit Impact Report details how the Lottery impacts each of Pennsylvania's 67 counties, including funding for senior programs, prize payouts and retailer commissions and bonuses.
